Mr. Frank Krone of Northwest Historical Perspectives will give a military history talk on Thursday the 11th of October, at 7:00 PM at the Fort Vancouver Regional Library Klickitat Room. The subject: the Medal of Honor and the Pacific Northwest.

The Congressional Medal of Honor was created by Congress during the Civil War to recognize notable or supreme acts of heroism on the part of United States service members. Since its creation less than 4,000 medals have been awarded. Four soldiers who served at the Barracks and are buried in its Post Cemetery. Other service members who were born in the Pacific Northwest,

or served there also received the Congressional Medal of Honor and are buried elsewhere. This talk discusses the Medal, and highlights some of its recipients

There is no admission fee. The presentation will last approximately 60 minutes, from 6:45 PM to 7:45 PM in the Klickitat Room.
