

# *The Liberation of Concentration Camp Dora Mittelbau by the 104<sup>th</sup> Division Timberwolves*

**8:00 pm - 9:00 pm, Thursday, 11 April 2013**

**at the 40 et 8 Chateau**

The 104th Division, known as the Timberwolves, called the Pacific Northwest home for many years. Before it came to the Northwest, the 104th Division had an illustrious history in World War II. The 104<sup>th</sup> Division became one of the Holocaust Liberation units, when its soldiers helped liberate the Concentration Camp Dora Mittelbau, in Nordhausen, Germany. At Dora, slave laborers built the dreaded V2 rockets, which killed thousands of civilians and military personnel in Europe. This talk given by Major Jefferson Davis (ret.) includes photographs of the camp, then and now, as well as an audio recording from one of the liberators.

The presentation will last about 60 minutes, from 8:00 PM to 9:00 PM in the 40 et 8 Chateau. This no admission fee. This is the entrance to the 40 et 8 Chateau parking lot. The Chateau is the white building at the south end of the parking lot. The talk will be held in the Boxcar Room.
