From the earliest days of the United States military, it was a common practice to move units from one location to another. This was done for many reasons. Sometimes units moved to gain expertise in fighting in many different environments. Others moved as periodic breaks from hostile environments. The 14th Infantry Regiment (known as the Bloody Fourteenth) was one such unit. Formed in the early days of the Civil War, it fought at Antietam, Chancellorsville, Gettysburg, Wilderness and Petersburg. Following the Civil War, the 14th Infantry Regiment served in the Pacific Northwest several times. Its post-Civil War fame came, when it led the assault on Manila in the Spanish American War, and later rotated to the Western Pacific in the early 20th Century. Many people called the 14th Infantry Regiment, Vancouver's Own.
