

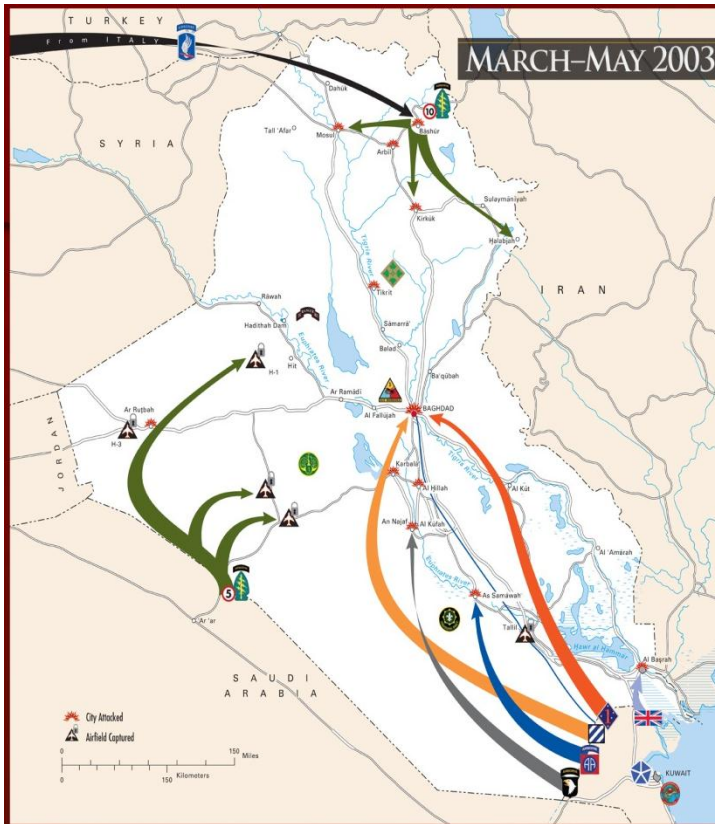
Unintended Consequences: Operations Enduring and Iraqi Freedom (OEF & OIF)

A talk spanning 9/11/2001 through current events surrounding the “Arab Uprising,” with primary focus on our “liberation” of Iraq that became an *occupation* when J. Paul Bremer virtually fired the entire Iraqi military (debaathification). Presented by Chief Warrant Officer 3 (Retired) Dan Sockle.

In March 2003, the United States and its Coalition of allies extended what was then called the International War on Terrorism to Iraq. Their invasion, which began on 20 March reached Baghdad in a little over a month. The Coalition security mission began in late May of 2003 and lasted nearly a decade.

In the years after the successful invasion of Iraq, the Coalition strategies did not go as planned either inside of Iraq or outside. In part this was due to a lack of understanding of the peoples of Southwest Asia, their religion and customs.

The presentation will last about 60 minutes, from 7:00 PM to 8:00 PM in the 40 et 8 Chateau. This no
